Big Tech, why not?

- Power abuse
 - Monopoly allows for one sided decisions, also in open source projects (for example Chromium).
 - Lobbying for political influence.
 - And (political) use of dependence.
 - Commercial companies want to earn, not necessarily improve.
- Linear connection between Big Tech SNS and societal problems.
 - Increased depression rates, suicide attempts and succeeded suicides among teenagers and youngsters.
 - Polarization in society.
 - Distribution and normalization of factual non-truths.
 - Shortened attention range.

But don't they care?

- No, not really...
 - activity → seeing ads → \$\$\$
 - And so:
 - Get people addicted!
 - The more data, the better they can build something that entices you.
 - But often that's not the “boring” nuances truth.
- And no, **nobody** is immune.
 - Also not if you know how it works.
 - Not even the creators themselves.





Outside of social media

Get you stuck in an ecosystem.

- Lure in
- Get stuck
- Enshitification & abuse of dependency

Open software:

- Chromium → Manifest V3.
- RCS → one sided additions.
- AOSP → Play Integrity API.





Then, how go without?

It's not all or nothing, every bit helps!

FOSS or not?

- All FOSS is *possible*, but generally not practical.
- Often a mix of FOSS and proprietary.

- Lot's more lists.

Start simple, what can you do on your own?

- MS Office → **LibreOffice**
- Gmail/Outlook → Proton Mail, **VPS with mail server**
- Chrome → **LibreWolf**
- Android → **GrapheneOS, Linux**
- OneDrive → **NextCloud**, TransIP Stack, Proton Drive
- Password in browser → 1Password, **Bitwarden**, Proton Pass, **Keepass**

And of course:

- Windows/MacOS → **Linux**



What about the socials?

- Socials are nothing without users...
- So don't be part of the problem.

FOMO?

No need!

Important things will come! But only when needed...

- Still don't dare? Do both!



Convince others?

- Be nice.
- Use prudence.
- Don't get angry at the people.





But... A lot of that cost money!

You always pay.

- With data, with all the just mentioned issues.
- Or with something else?

Support your software!

- Money.
- Work.
 - Not only programming, but also testing, translating and business management.
- Spread the word!
 - You don't need to have an audience (but it does help 😊)
 - Mouth to mouth advertisement is the most effective type in existence.



But the F in FOSS!

“Free as in freedom”

- Not “no money”.

Everything cost money!

Always? Truly always?

- Yeah, basically so.
- Everything cost money, free does not exist.

Then who pays FOSS?

- Donations
- Companies
- paid side-projects and services

Oke, excluded hobby projects.

- But once those grow...

IT'S
FREE





Then what about companies?

- “You can never secure that”
- “It doesn’t work”/“it’s inefficient”.
- “That doesn’t work with what our customers are using”.

But the only one that’s really true:

- But that’s not an ecosystem!

So:

- Certain knowledge and skill is needed.
- FOSS is not a way to cut cost, but moves cost.

But:

- In the current geopolitical climate, do you want to outsource that to Big Tech?
- Good selling-point: no US-dependency, own knowledge.





Companies are trendsetters and normalizers!
The bigger, the more that's true.
